## Clearwater Marine Aquarium to Release Sea Turtles Cheetah and Elektra February 2 at Sandpearl Resort

**Clearwater, FL (February 1, 2016)** – Clearwater Marine Aquarium (CMA), a marine life rescue center, will be releasing two sea turtles back to the Gulf of Mexico tomorrow, February 2, 2015.

Aptly named, Cheetah's recovery at CMA was rather speedy. The Kemp's ridley turtle arrived at CMA only last week on January 26, 2016. Cheetah was one of the nearly 30 turtles rescued by CMA that week that were cold-stunned. As with the other recently recovered turtles, Cheetah was deeply affected by the cooler water temperatures, causing his circulatory system to slow. With a clean bill of health from CMA veterinarian, Dr. Shelly Marquardt, Cheetah has fully recovered and is ready to return to the gulf.

Elektra, a young green sea turtle, was rescued by the CMA Stranding Team on June 17, 2015. Caught in a gill net, the turtle was discovered with pink tumors on its body. Upon arrival at CMA, it was concluded that Elektra had the Fibropapilloma virus, a highly contagious condition commonly found in green sea turtles. At CMA, these tumors are typically treated multiple times with a laser before the turtle is clear. In Elektra's case, the tumors were cleared in a single surgery. With no tumors emerging post-operation, Elektra is cleared for release.

For CMA, these speedy recoveries are not only a testament to the hard work of the turtle team, but also a financial relief for the aquarium. The average cost of rehabilitation for one sea turtle at CMA is \$300 a day; quick turnarounds allow the team to help more turtles.
